INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS OF MEMOIRS

The Society's Memoir series presents original monographs or symposia in the field of American Archaeology. These are issued at irregular intervals as supplements to American Antiquity.

Papers submitted for consideration must be of considerable length. They should follow the form of American Antiquity, particularly in respect to the rules listed inside the back cover of the journal.

The Society provides a limited amount in its budget to assist in the publication of Memoirs. In no case will its contribution cover more than half the cost. The number of pages, tables, charts, and illustrations is restricted only by the available funds.

Memoirs are published in order of completion of the arrangements for publication. That is, a Memoir must have been approved by the Editor, be in shape to send to the printer, and the funds for its publication must have been made available to the Treasurer before it can receive priority.

Galley proof, only, will be sent to authors, who will be charged for lengthy or unusual changes therein. Upon publication, manuscripts, illustrations, and engravings will be destroyed unless their return has been specifically requested.

Each author will receive five free copies of his Memoir and he will have the opportunity to order beforehand additional copies at cost. Reprints of parts of Memoirs cannot be supplied.
