**T**his volume contains the primary documents of the *Historikerstreit*, the debate sparked by Ernst Nolte's controversial revisionist interpretation of the Holocaust, which was hotly contested by Jürgen Habermas and other left-wing German intellectuals in the late 1980s. The whole issue is important both for the historical positioning of the concept of German national identity and for an understanding of contemporary German politics.

First published in 1987 in Germany under the title *Historikerstreit*, where it sold over 65,000 copies and attracted enormous attention, this volume is now available in a complete English translation.

This is compelling reading for students of modern German political history and of Holocaust studies and will be well suited for classroom use.
