#### LONDON SCHOOL OF HYGIENE AND TROPICAL MEDICINE

(University of London)

Incorporating the Ross Institute and the TUC Centenary Institute

Full-time courses, starting annually in October and lasting for an academic year, except where stated below, Full-time courses, starting annually in October and lasting for an academic year, except where stated below, are held for the following diplomas and MSc degrees of the University of London: (diplomas) BACTERI-OLOGY, CLINICAL MEDICINE OF THE TROPICS, TROPICAL PUBLIC HEALTH; (MSc degrees) HUMAN NUTRITION, MEDICAL DEMOGRAPHY, MEDICAL PARASITOLOGY, MEDICAL STATISTICS, OCCUPATIONAL HYGIENE, OCCUPATIONAL MEDICINE, SOCIAL MEDICINE; for the Diploma in HUMAN NUTRITION of the School; and for the Diplomas in INDUSTRIAL HEALTH and TROPICAL MEDICINE AND HYGIENE of the Examining Board in England by the Royal College of Physicians of London and the Royal College of Surgeons of England.

Part-time courses are held in MEDICAL STATISTICS and EPIDEMIOLOGY.

Facilities are available for suitable candidates to study for the degrees of MPhil and PhD in appropriate subjects.

Fees for full-time courses are £250 a year; for part-time courses they are variable in relation to the full-time fee.

DIPLOMA IN BACTERIOLOGY (LONDON)

For graduates in medicine, science, veterinary science or pharmacy who intend to follow a career in microbiology. Closing date for applications: March 1. The number of places is strictly limited.

DIPLOMA IN CLINICAL MEDICINE OF THE TROPICS (LONDON) Designed particularly for the training of intending specialist physicians and medical research workers in the tropics. Closing date for applications: March 1.

DIPLOMA IN TROPICAL PUBLIC HEALTH (LONDON)

Intended for medical practitioners proposing to make a career in public health administration or in preventive medicine in the tropics. Closing date for applications: March 1.

MSc in HUMAN NUTRITION

For medical practitioners and graduates in science or agriculture with a biochemical or physiological back-ground. Applicants not qualifying for an MSc degree may attend the course and sit a School examination for the Diploma in Human Nutrition. After the written examination MSc students will carry out practical work-which may take place overseas-for at least six months and will submit a written report. Closing date for applications: April 1.

MSc in MEDICAL DEMOGRAPHY

For graduates in medicine, science or social science with suitable experience. Candidates with insufficient experience of the kind required may be accepted on condition that they take not less than two academic years and attend specified courses in the School during the first year. Closing date for applications: March 1. MSc in MEDICAL PARASITOLOGY

Designed mainly for graduates in medicine, veterinary medicine and veterinary science, but graduates in science or persons with approved non-graduate qualifications in medicine and veterinary medicine can be accepted. Gives training with special emphasis on parasitic and vector-borne diseases in the tropics. Closing date for applications: March 1. The number of places is strictly limited.

MSc in MEDICAL STATISTICS

Intended for graduates with a mathematics background and a good general knowledge of mathematical statistics. Closing date for applications: March 1.

MSc in OCCUPATIONAL HYGIENE

Designed for graduates in physics, chemistry, engineering, medicine or allied subjects. Closing date for applications: April 1.

MSc in OCCUPATIONAL MEDICINE

For registered medical practitioners, covering all aspects of occupational health and also fulfilling the requirements for the Diploma in Industrial Health of the Royal Colleges. Previous experience in occupational medicine is not essential. Closing date for applications: February 1.

#### MSc in SOCIAL MEDICINE

A two-year course, starting each autumn, designed to provide professional training for doctors wishing to specialize in social medicine and follow careers in either medical administration and community medicine or teaching and research in social medicine. Students must be medically qualified and have had at least two years' clinical experience. A limited number of bursaries are available to suitable candidates. Closing date for applications: March 1.

DIPLOMA IN INDUSTRIAL HEALTH

A three-months' course from October to December for suitably qualified medical practitioners. Closing date for applications: April 1.

DIPLOMA IN TROPICAL MEDICINE AND HYGIENE (ENGLAND) A five-months' course for medical practitioners starting each year in February. Closing date for applications: May 1.

COURSES IN MEDICAL STATISTICS AND EPIDEMIOLOGY

Part-time courses in medical statistics and/or epidemiology (courses S1/2, E1) are held occupying various mornings from October to December. In general, only applicants with a medical qualification will be accepted. Extended training in these subjects is offered from January to March (courses E2, S3). Applicants may be accepted for a combined course consisting of all four courses, i.e. S1/2, E1, E2, S3. Closing date for applications: June 1.
