

This new bilingual quarterly will publish peer-reviewed articles in English or Spanish dealing with the archaeology, prehistory, and ethnohistory of Mesoamerica, Central America, South America, and culturally related areas. LATIN AMERICAN ANTIQUITY will be edited by Prudence M. Rice with the assistance of a five-member Board of Editors: E. Wyllys Andrews (Middle American Research Institute), Frederick W. Lange (Colorado Museum), Jaime Litvak King (Universidad de las Americas, Puebla), Joyce Marcus (Michigan), and Don S. Rice (Virginia). The Board will be further assisted by an international Editorial Advisory Committee comprising 22 archaeologists.
