In addition, the **Certificate in Transnational Law** program provides a solid grounding in subjects such as public international law, conflict of laws, comparative law, uniform legislation and European law (taught in French) [www.unige.ch/droit/transnational/index.html] and the **Duke-Geneva Institute in Transnational Law** is a summer program (taught in English) bringing together American and European law students from across both continents [www.law.duke.edu/internat/europe].

The Law School of the University of Geneva also welcomes foreign students who wish to pursue a **bachelor's degree in Swiss law** (in French), which includes compulsory courses in both public and private international law and offers many options in international law [www.unige.ch/droit/etudes/formation/bachelor.html].






