IAU Symposium No. 111, "Calibration of Fundamental Stellar Quantities", was held at Villa Olmo, Como, Italy, on May 24-29, 1984. ings held in the past ten years on related topics include: IAU Symposium No. 109, "Astrometric Techniques", held at the University of Florida in Jan., 1984, "The MK Process and Stellar Classification", held at the University of Toronto in June, 1983, "Stellar Absolute Energy Distributions", an unpublished Joint Meeting (Commissions 25 and 45), held at the General Assembly of the IAU in Patras, Greece in August, 1982, IAU Colloquium No. 62, "Current Techniques in Double and Multiple Star Research", held at Northern Arizona University in May, 1981, the ESO Workshop: "Methods of Abundance Determination for Stars", held in Geneva in March, 1980, "Problems of Calibration of Multicolor Photometric Systems", held at Dudley Observatory in March, 1979, IAU Colloquium No. 48, "Modern Astrometry", held at the University of Vienna in Sept., 1978, IAU Colloquium No. 50, "High Angular Resolution Stellar Interferometry" held at the University of Maryland in Aug., 1978, "Spectral Classification of the Future", held at the Vatican in July, 1978 and IAU Symposium No. 72, "Abundance Effects in Classification", held at the University of Lausanne in July, 1975. The present meeting was the first to cover the broad range of the calibration of fundamental stellar quartities in one meeting.

Nine commissions of the IAU co-sponsored the meeting. These were: Commission 5 (Documentation and Astronomical Data), 24 (Photographic Astrometry), 25 (Stellar Photometry and Polarimetry), 26 (Double and Multiple Stars), 29 (Stellar Spectra), 30 (Radial Velocities), 35 (Stellar Constitution), 37 (Star Clusters and Associations), 42 (Close Binary Stars) and 45 (Stellar Classification). The SOC consisted of A. H. Batten (Chairman), M. Gerbaldi, B. Gustafsson, B. Hauck, D. S. Hayes, C. Jaschek, G. Lyngå, H. A. McAlister, L. E. Pasinetti, A. G. D. Philip and V. Straižys. The LOC consisted of L. E. Pasinetti (Chairman), E. Antonello, G. Casati, M. Fracassini, L. Mantegazza and L. Pastori.

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In the four and one-half days of the Symposium 85 papers were given, 20 of which were spoken papers and 65 of which were poster papers. The proceedings of the Symposium have been edited from camera-ready copy submitted by the authors. The discussion was prepared from hand-written sheets filled out by the participants in the discussion. Those manuscripts which diverged too much from the correct style or from good English were retyped. We have made a great effort to increase the uniformity in format and language of the manuscripts. Individual authors have been made responsible for obtaining permission to copy material from other publications.

The host institution was the Universitá degli Studi di Milano, and the Centro di Cultura Scientifica A. Volta hosted the meeting at Villa Olmo, Como. Financial support was received from:
