Burton's Mass is one of only a handful by English composers to use a non-liturgical cantus firmus and the only one based on the hexachord. The second bass part, missing in the only source (the Forrest-Heyther part books) has been reconstructed by the editor.

This interesting Mass, never published before, forms part of our new Catalogue No. 4. Also newly published is a high-pitch edition of Taverner's Mass Corona spinea by Jason Smart. Both this and the Burton will be published next year in editions at source pitch.

Other new pieces in the English series are the <u>Lamentations</u> of Osbert Parsley, Hugh Aston's <u>Gaude mater</u> and three double-choir motets by Peter Philips. In our Spanish, Franco-Flemish, German/Slav, Italian, Lassus and Instrumental series twenty-four new works are published; one of the most noteworthy is <u>Ecce beatam lucem</u> by Alessandro Striggio for 40 parts, edited by Hugh Keyte.
