The majority of these samples, together with other items of historical interest, have now been catalogued; and all are available for study.

19. Dr E. J. Lindgren has presented examples of Karesuando Lapp clothing and equipment, specially collected for the Institute by Mr Mikel Utsi. This collection, which has been on view since February, comprises a man's winter outfit, skis and ski stick, reindeer harness and *pulk*.

20. Mr T. W. Bagshawe has presented a museum case, which is the more welcome in view of the difficulty of obtaining cabinets.
