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## Infection Control Issues on the Internet

SHEA members, and others working in the areas of infection control, increasingly are using Internet resources for communication with each other, as well as for accessing documents. During the early summer, a wide array of issues including appropriate methicillin-resistant *Staphylococcus aureus* control measures, swine influenza archeology, mad cow disease, and current outbreaks around the world

have been accessible easily by subscribing to the PROMED digest. To subscribe to the PROMED digest, address e-mail PROMED to <major-domo@usa.healthnet.org>. The message should consist of only one line: subscribe PROMED digest. It is just as easy to cancel the subscription or to take advantage of other PROMED options. The only cost is that of your e-mail access and connect time.

## Infection Control Contracting With Managed Care

At the recent SHEA/IDSA/OPIVITA conference in Chicago on "Managed Care in Infectious Diseases," the workshop consensus on infection control and quality improvement was that SHEA could be more useful to its members by highlighting examples of the variety of infection control and quality improvement niche contracting that currently is taking place between hospitals, as well as managed care organizations, and SHEA members. Many organizations are identifying and paying infection control epidemiologists to review and give specific antibiotic prescribing patterns on an ongoing basis.
