SAINT DOMINIC Servant but Friend

Loyal Service to Christ finds its reward in divine friendship. He told His followers: 'I will not now call you servants, but friends.' The promise of these words inspired a new approach to the study of the virtues of St Dominic Guzman. Sister Assumpta recalls Dante's tribute to St Dominic-friend fast-knit to Christ'-and deftly demonstrates that the founder of the Order of Preachers achieved saintly success in preaching, defence of sacred truth, and in his personal holiness because of this union of friendship with Christ. A study of his life and works in the light of this divine friendship reveals the striking likeness of the Saint to his Friend, and contributes to an understanding of the ideals of the Order which he founded.
