This lexicon of the Mehri language brings to a conclusion the important series of works by the late Professor T. M. Johnstone on Modern South Arabian Languages, begun with his *Ḥarsūsi Lexicon* and *Jibbāli Lexicon*. It is based on data collected during his own field work in Oman and those derived from Mehri speakers in London and in the Gulf.

This book contains a lengthy linguistic introduction which concentrates on the phonology and morphology of the Mehri language. The lexicon proper follows, providing examples of the syntax of the language in numerous verbatim quotations from informants. The book ends with an English-Mehri word-list and index of the definitions provided in Professor Johnstone's earlier *Jibbāli Lexicon*, for which an English-Jibbāli word-list was not provided.
