Emissions Trading Schemes Markets, States and Law Sanja Bogojevic

Over the last four decades emissions trading has enjoyed a high profile in environmental law scholarship and in environmental law and policy. Much of the discussion is promotional, preferring emissions trading above other regulatory strategies without, however, engaging with legal complexities embedded in conceptualising, scrutinising and managing emissions trading regimes. The combined effect of these debates is to create a perception that emissions trading is a straightforward regulatory strategy, imposable across various jurisdictions and environmental settings. This book shows that this view is problematic for at least two reasons. First, emissions trading responds to distinct environmental and non-environmental goals, including creating profit-centres, substituting bureaucratic control of resources, and ensuring regulatory compliance. Second, the governance structures of emissions trading regimes are culture-specific, which is a significant reminder of the importance of law in understanding not only how emissions trading schemes function but also what meaning is given to them as regulatory strategies. Ultimately, this book makes a strong argument for reconfiguring the common understanding of emissions trading schemes as regulatory strategies, and sets out a framework for analysis to sustain that reconfiguration.

Today's world is post-colonial and post-Cold War. These twin characteristics explain why international society is also riddled by the two major forms of injustice which

Nancy Fraser identified as afflicting national societies. First, the economic and social disparities between states caused outcry in the 1950s when the first steps were taken towards decolonisation. Second, international society is increasingly confronted with culture- and identity-related claims, stretching the dividing line between equality and difference. In answer to these two forms of claim, the subjects of international society have come up with two types of remedy encapsulated in legal rules: the law of development and the law of recognition, the first milestones towards what might become a fairer international society.

The ASIL Holtzmann Center is established in honor of Judge Howard M. Holtzmann. Over the course of his career, Judge Holtzmann has made enormous contributions to the field of international arbitration and conciliation. and mentored scores of young lawyers working in the field. He was central to the American Arbitration Association (AAA) work with the Arbitration Institute of the Stockholm Chamber of Commerce to build an East-West bridge through international arbitration. Notable achievements include: service as a member of the U.S. delegation to the Arbitration Working Group of the UN Commission on International Trade Law (1974-2011), which produced the UNCITRAL Arbitration Rules, the UNCITRAL Conciliation Rules, and the UNCITRAL Model Law on International Commercial Arbitration, and service as a Member of the Iran-U.S. Claims Tribunal (1981-1994). For his pioneering work, the King of Sweden inducted Judge Holtzmann as a Commander of the Royal Order of the Polar Star in 2003. In 2005. he received the Silver Medal of Honor of Vienna, and in 2006, the AAA gave him its highest honor, the Peacemaker Award, for his "work to further peace throughout the world." Judge Holtzmann has been a member of ASIL since 1972.
