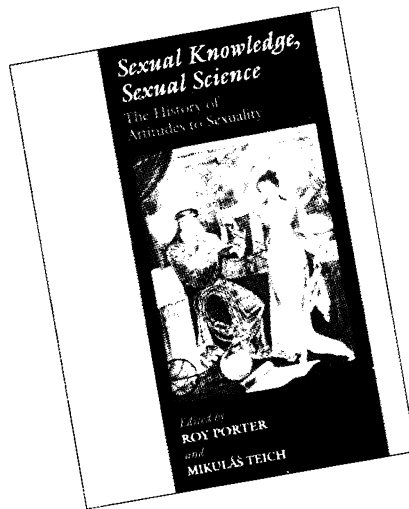

In this wide-ranging survey, W. F. Bynum examines the parallel development of biomedical sciences, clinical practice and preventive medicine in 19th century Europe and North America.

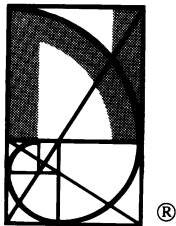
