LORD COHEN OF WALMER — IN MEMORIAM

The brilliant career of Lionel Leonard Cohen has already been recalled elsewhere and his outstanding qualities extolled: we would associate the Israel Law Review to the general tribute being paid to the deceased.

He was born in Kent in 1888 and received his education at Eton and Oxford. In 1913 he was called to the Bar, in 1943 to the Bench as a Judge of the High Court in the Chancery Division, in 1946 he was elevated to the Court of Appeal and in 1951 he became a Lord of Appeal in Ordinary.

In addition to his judicial functions, he was frequently appointed a member of administrative or advisory boards and committees whose recommendations greatly contributed to shape the destinies of post-war Britain. Having in his early days worked in the chambers of Alfred Topham, he soon became an expert on Company Law; and the Companies Act, 1948, was mainly due to the activities of the Company Law Amendments Committee of which he was the Chairman and animator and which justly bears his name.

Lord Cohen was deeply conscious of his link with the Jewish people and never hesitated to express his loyalty to Judaism. He was active in many representative Jewish bodies and served as President of the Union of Liberal and Progressive Synagogues. In recognition of his interest in the Hebrew University of Jerusalem, the British Friends of the Hebrew University established the "Lionel Cohen Foundation", under whose auspices an invitation is sent annually to a prominent lawyer from the Commonwealth to visit Israel and lecture at the Faculty of Law in Jerusalem. Most appropriately Lord Cohen himself was placed on the list of guests and in 1957 he delivered his lecture on English company law.

His decease is deeply regretted in Jerusalem and his memory will be revered forever.
