Typescript. Typescript, double-spaced, may be submitted (in duplicate) to any member of the Editorial Board. Postage for return of the typescript should be included. A bibliographical list of cited references should be headed 'References', placed on a separate sheet, in alphabetical order, and numbered. *Simple* citations should then be made by employing in the text, *rather than by footnote*, the appropriate numerical reference to this list. Discursive footnotes should be numbered consecutively throughout the typescript. *Typescript should not exceed thirty double-spaced pages. A summary abstract of approximately 100 words should accompany each article.* All formulas and equations should be put in such a form as to help minimize the number of printed lines in the journal. In the following examples the form on the right is preferable to that on the left:

$$(1) \quad p = -\frac{dx}{dy} = -\frac{dz}{dt} \qquad p = -dx/dy = -dz/dt$$

$$(2) \quad \lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} \frac{1}{n} \qquad \lim_{n \rightarrow \infty} 1/n$$
