GRANTS FOR RESEARCH ON INTERNATIONAL ORGANIZATION

A Program Offered by the Social Science Research Council

In this program initiated in 1963-1964 support is offered to social scientists possessing the Ph.D. or its equivalent for field studies of multilateral processes in international affairs, with emphasis on change in activities of agencies, in relationships between agencies and governments, and in organizational patterns. The committee administering the program will accept proposals for research, for example, on changes over time in objectives and roles of international organizations; new multilateral arrangements for the advancement of common purposes; political or technical interaction between international organizations or between organizations and governments or regional groups; and the experience of organizations in attempting to influence policies of governments in such areas as public health, economic integration, or political development. The committee wishes to encourage comparative studies of relationships and agencies, and research that may contribute to the development of theory; it is also especially interested in research on regional international organizations in Africa, Asia, and Latin America.

Prospective applicants are invited to write to the Social Science Research Council, 230 Park Avenue, New York, New York 10017, by December 1, 1965. Letters should describe the substance and method of the proposed research in some detail. Previous research in the field of international organization is not required of applicants. The committee may invite qualified persons in the United States or abroad to undertake research under this program in order to broaden the range of comparative studies.

Stipends may provide for maintenance in lieu of salary for a year or longer, and for travel expenses and other research expenses. Research may be undertaken in 1966-1967.

WORLD PEACE FOUNDATION

The World Peace Foundation announces completion of a three-year systematic study of evolving behavior of the American South toward foreign policy since the Neutrality Act of 1935. Southerners have shifted since then from the regional group most enthusiastic about active international participation and collective security to the geographic entity most hesitant about major spheres of international cooperation.

The first of the two volumes reporting the results of this ground-breaking research, Charles O. Lerche, Jr., *The Uncertain South: Its Changing Patterns in Foreign Policy*, was published last summer by Quadrangle Books of Chicago. Mr. Lerche systematically examines the changing roll-call voting patterns of Southern Congressmen and pertinent forces operating on them from diverse Southern constituencies. The author, formerly Professor of Political Science at Emory University in Atlanta, Georgia, is Professor of International Relations at The American University in Washington, D.C.

Alfred O. Hero, Jr., The Southerner and World Affairs, is being published by the Louisiana State University Press of Baton Rouge in June 1965. Mr. Hero first examines changing attitudes since 1935 within the South as a whole toward foreign peoples, intercultural exchanges, immigration, national defense, arms control, collective security, world trade, the Communist and neutralist worlds, foreign aid, and international organization. He then considers comparative reactions toward these issues by major racial, ethnic, religious, educational, socioeconomic, rural-to-metropolitan, and subregional groups within the former Confederacy. Southern thought and action which have diverged from national norms are traced to values, raditions, and habits of mind prevalent among particular Southern groups. This volume also attempts to relate empirically evident trends in interfational attitudes to changing economic, racial, and other developments in the region and to shifting emphases in United States foreign policy. Con-Eluding chapters deal with probable future trends and potentially effective means of broadening public understanding of international phenomena in the South. This book interprets the results of nearly a thousand surveys of national and regional opinion since the mid-1930's, extensive mass-media audience studies, content analyses of 53 Southern newspapers over these glecades, and special interviews of 1,100 influential Southerners in the early 1960's. Mr. Hero, a native of southern Louisiana, is Executive Secretary of the World Peace Foundation.
