The institute of German Studies at Indiana University has received the sum of DM 326,000 from the Volkswagen Foundation for a "Comparative System Analysis, BRD/USA." Project Coordinator will be Louis F. Helbig, Institute Director. This research and publication project calls for a systematic comparison of some aspects of West German and American society in six areas, each to be coordinated by German Studies experts on the Bloomington Campus: socio-politics (Alfred Diamant, West European Studies), socioeconomics (Hans B. Thorelli, Business), financial planning and overseas investments (Franz Gehrels, Economics), education (Howard D. Mehlinger, Social Studies Development Center), environment and public administration (Lynton K. Caldwell, School of Public and Environmental Affairs), and culture (Louis F. Helbig, IGS). Several visiting professorships, research assistantships, a second German Studies Conference, and a publication series of "IGS Working Papers" are part of this venture planned for 1974-77.
