## TO THOSE WISHING TO SUBMIT MANUSCRIPTS

Manuscripts for consideration should be submitted in four double-spaced typed copies. Footnotes should be double-spaced and placed at the end of the manuscript. Please do not use dot matrix printers. Manuscripts are sent to referees anonymously and should be prepared accordingly. Library of Congress transliteration system and the Chicago Manual of Style are to be followed. In general, articles should not exceed twentyfive pages $81 / 2 \times 11$ inches in dimension. If larger sheets must be used, please retain the margins of an $81 / 2$-by-11 page. Manuscripts will not be returned unless postage is included.
The policy of the Slavic Review is not to consider materials that have been published or that are being considered for publication elsewhere.
Publication of articles in the Slavic Review is ordinarily limited to those submitted by members of the AAASS. Nonmembers wishing to submit manuscripts are asked to request a membership application.
