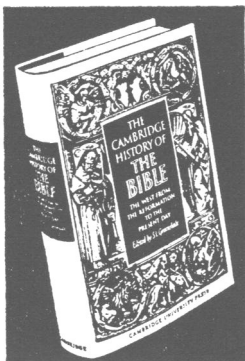

The core of his argument is that the clear-cut issue between the traditionalists and the radical believers in man's natural sovereignty was not the primary cause for the ultimate decline of ecclesiastical power.

Instead, he demonstrates that it was the moderates—who attempted to compromise by drawing lines between papal and secular power—who most effectively undermined the Church's sovereignty. 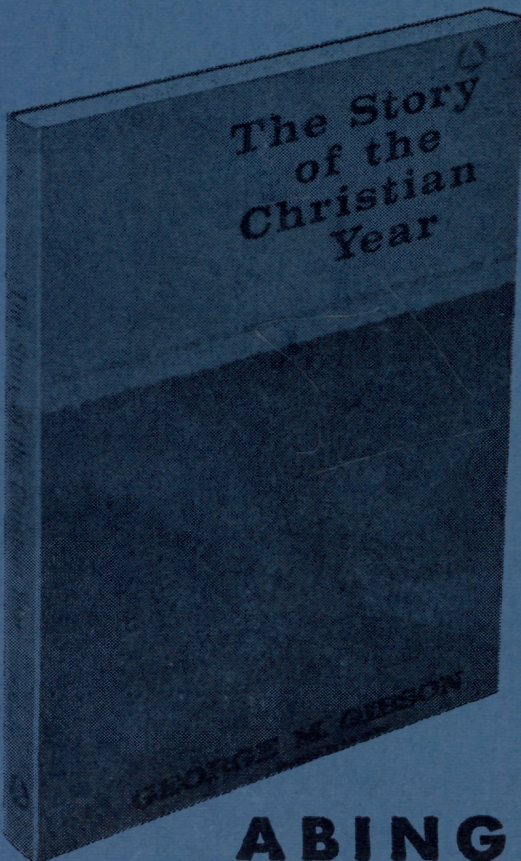
