

# NOTES FOR CONTRIBUTORS

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The general arrangement of the paper should be as follows: Introduction; Methods; Results; Discussion; Summary of results; References. Tables, explanations of text-figures or plates, and keys to the abbreviations used on figures should be on separate sheets (see below).

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Surname of author(s), initials; year of publication; title of paper; title of journal (abbreviated according to the *World List of Scientific Periodicals* and underlined); volume number; first and last page numbers of the work cited. When books are listed, the title of the book should be underlined and it should be followed by the town of publication and the name of the publisher.
