## Spectacular Bodies: the Art and Science of the Human Body at

the Hayward Gallery, London. This extraordinary and ambitious exhibition brings together more than 300 treasures from some 80 medical and art museums and collections worldwide. Works of art spanning five centuries, including the anatomical drawings of Leonardo, Michelangelo, Dürer and Stubbs, 17th century Dutch portraits of surgeons at work and outstanding paintings by Rembrandt, Géricault and Courbet, will be shown alongside remarkable life-size anatomical models, medical instruments and prints and drawings used in the study of the human face and body.

Spectacular Bodies promises to be a revelatory show, providing an enlightening new context for an extraordinary collection of material much of which has never before been seen in an art gallery. The exhibition is on at the Hayward Gallery, London, from 19 October 2000-14 January 2001. Opening hours are 10am-6pm daily and until 8pm on Tuesdays and Wednesdays. The title of the talk is 'The Brain'.
