All scientific papers published in PDM are submitted to subject content and methods experts for peer review. Authors and reviewers are blinded (not aware of the identity of each other). Peer reviewers must declare that there is not a conflict of interest with any manuscript they agree to review. Peer review is accomplished by means of a standard scoring system and specific comments, the results and contents of which are returned to authors for their review.

Peer review is the objective assessment of manuscripts submitted to journals by experts who have no connection with the research or preparation of the manuscript under review. Peer review is an important extension of the scientific process. PDM is also a signatory with the international Committee On Publishing Ethics (COPE). PDM follows the COPE guidelines for journal management that are available on the organization website.

Peer review of manuscripts submitted to PDM is done in a blinded manner with the reviewer and authors unknown to each other. Content expert reviewers for a manuscript are selected based on their area of expertise. Methods reviewers are expert in study design and data analysis and assess manuscripts for scientific validity. Blinded reviews are used by PDM Editors to determine the priority for publishing manuscripts.
