Each proposal must include an abstract that summarizes its thesis, method, and significance, together with a *curriculum vitae* for each participant.

Within the overall framework of the program, the committee especially seeks proposals for papers and panels on historiography; teaching methodologies; theological education; religion and society; evangelization, indigenization and the spread of Christianity; Canada-USA-Mexico and different groupings within those countries. PHILIP SCHAFF PRIZE

The American Society of Church History takes pleasure in announcing the 1985–1986 Philip Schaff Prize. The prize is in the amount of \$1,000.00 to be paid to the author of the best book originating in the North American scholarly community, and presenting original research or interpretation in the history of Christianity or any period thereof.

Books considered for this award must be published during the years 1985 or 1986. Any member of the Society may nominate titles for consideration for the Schaff Prize. Copies of books nominated do not have to be submitted. Titles nominated for consideration of the award must be received by the Chairperson of the Committee on Research of the Society or William B. Miller, Secretary, American Society of Church History, 305 East Country Club Lane, Wallingford, PA 19086, by March 1, 1987. The announcement of the winner of the Schaff Prize will be made at the annual meeting of the Society in December 1987.

If competing essays are otherwise of equal quality, preference will be given to those topics relating to the history of Congregationalism.

The award will be announced at the spring meeting of the Society in 1986.
