PAUL GUGGENHEIM PRIZE

In November 1985, the third Paul Guggenheim Prize was awarded to M. Jean-Pierre Laviec for his work entitled 'Promotion et protection des investissements. Etude de droit international économique'.

The Board of the Paul Guggenheim Foundation has decided to award the next Prize of 12.000.— Swiss francs in 1987.

The Paul Guggenheim Prize is periodically awarded to a work on public international law of outstanding importance and quality, which is the first major work of its author. Works submitted may be in the form of published books or of manuscripts intended for publication; they may be written in English, French, German, Italian or Spanish. Works which have already received a prize of a similar nature will not be considered.

Works must be submitted *before 31 January 1987* to the Paul Guggenheim Foundation, The Graduate Institute of International Studies, 132, rue de Lausanne, 1202 Geneva (Switzerland).
