Although the spread of culture has often been a forerunner of conquest, only in modern times has cultural diplomacy become a conscious means of aggression; and the Soviet Union, following Marxist doctrine, has been the world's most active and expert practitioner of the cultural offensive. In this book Professor Barghoorn, who served as Press Attache at the U.S. Embassy in Moscow from 1943 to 1947 and made three trips to the Soviet Union after the death of Stalin, analyzes the role of Soviet cultural diplomacy in areas of the free world, and offers suggestions for future Western policy. *400 pages. \$7.50*

## The Calas Affair

Persecution, Toleration, and Heresy in Eighteenth-Century Toulouse

The Calas affair, made famous by Voltaire, was an anachronism. In an age of declining religious sentiment, Catholics nonetheless identified individual Protestants with the antisocial qualities they saw in historical Protestantism. David D. Bien probes the social and religious conditions and complex psychological attitudes that lay behind the execution of the Huguenot, Jean Calas. The author recreates the incident in its actual milieu, to study the changing Catholic stereotypes of Protestants from 1750 to 1789, and to show the general nature and capacities of French Catholicism before the Revolution. *208 pages. \$4*
