

FROM COLLECTIVE SECURITY TO PREVENTIVE DIPLOMACY Readings in International Organization and the Maintenance of Peace and Security

Edited by JOEL LARUS, Brandeis University.

This book examines how the concept of collective security has fared in the League of Nations and the United Nations and why it has been superseded by what the late Dag Hammarskjöld called "preventative diplomacy."

The editor believes that the most revealing way to study the collective peace-keeping operations of the League and the UN is to examine representative case histories. He includes four political crises of League history: the Greek-Bulgarian incident of 1925, Manchuria, Ethiopia, and the 1939 Russo-Finnish dispute. From the United Nations he has selected Korea, Suez, Hungary, and the Congo.

The customary academic essays are interspersed with original source materials; speeches and debates presented before the various organs of the League and the UN as well as from the reports and other pertinent documents. 1965. 556 pages. Paper: \$4.95. Cloth: \$6.95.


