Manuscripts and correspondence about them should be sent to the editors. All manuscript submissions must conform to the following conventions:

- Submit three copies, typed double-spaced, in a 12 point—or 10 characters per inch—font size. The text should not be longer than 25 pages.
- Maps, tables, charts and other illustrations must be camera-ready.
- Citations within the text should follow the author-date standard described in chapter 16 of the 14th edition of *A Manual of Style* (University of Chicago Press, 1993).
- Complete bibliographic references to the citations should be provided at the end of the essay in a section entitled "References." The standard is page 648 of the aforementioned A Manual of Style.
- "Notes" should follow the References. They should be formatted according to the conventions of *A Manual of Style*, sections 15.35–15:40.
- Manuscripts will be sent to external peer reviewers; include a removable cover page
 giving essay title, author name and mailing address, fax number and e-mail address, if
 available; title should be repeated on the first page of text, but the author's name
 should appear only on the cover page.
- Include an abstract of not more than 200 words.
- Include a signed statement that the essay has not been published and is not currently
 under consideration by other journals. The ASR will only consider unpublished manuscripts.

From the Editors

Thank you, manuscript reviewers! Your journal depends not only on the authors who write the essays and book reviews that appear in its pages, but also on the hundreds of individuals who have volunteered to read and to evaluate manuscripts for the *African Studies Review*.

When we receive a manuscript, we code it by discipline(s), topic(s), and African country(ies), then use those codes to search our database of over one thousand reviewers to identify individuals who would be in a good position to help us evaluate the quality of the manuscript. This is especially important given the scope of an interdisciplinary journal like the African Studies Review where the editors could not possibly have expertise in all the areas represented in the journal's pages.

Once we have chosen three or more reviewers, we send each one a request to evaluate the manuscript. Those who respond promptly are sent a copy of the manuscript, with any identifiers of the author removed. Most reviewers return their evaluation sheets and comments within two months, and we make our editorial decision, and forward along to the author all the external reviewers' comments, deleting any personal identifiers.

Often the reviews are either consistently positive or consistently negative, which makes it easy for us to accept or to reject a manuscript. Occasionally there are instances where external reviewers have contradictory assessments of a manuscript, in which case we often seek the involvement of more reviewers and get involved in assessing the manuscript ourselves.

What is unseen to ASR readers is the great amount of scholarship and help, especially to young authors, that each evaluation entails. Reviewers express to us their gratitude for being able to help us, and many authors put the external reviewer comments to good use in revising and improving their manuscripts, and express their own gratitude for the way the editorial process has improved their work.

The December 1999 issue of the ASR represents the sixth one we have edited since we began in late 1997. We have been inspired by the care, competence, and skill with which external reviewers have undertaken their unpaid and voluntary work in helping us put together these issues. Many

reviewers have evaluated two or more manuscripts. While we have sent each one a letter of thanks, we want our readers to know the identities of those who have helped us so much. Here are their names:
