Center for Studies on Mexican History Houses Documents

In order to facilitate the research of scholars in Mexican history, the Centro de Estudios de Historia de México, with financial aid from a commercial firm, Condumex, S. A., has developed an extensive and important collection of manuscripts, documents, photographs, and reference works which date from the sixteenth century to the present time. More than 35,000 volumes, 200,000 documents, and 5000 photographs are housed in the Centro library which makes them available to all interested historians. University of Florida Project of Serial Documentation Nears Completion

Begun in January 1965, the University of Florida-based project of listing of holdings in the United States and Canada for as many serial documents as could be identified for individual Latin American countries, from the time of each country's formation (or date of independence) through 1966, is nearing completion. Publication of the nineteen-volume set on Latin American Serial Documents will be by country: Volumes I and II, on Colombia and Brazil respectively, published in the fall 1968, are to be followed by volumes on Cuba and Mexico in mid-1969 and other countries, in alphabetical order, by 1970.
