By arrangement with the School of Slavonic and East European Studies of the University of London, the management and publication of the *Slavonic and East European Review* was taken over in 1941 for an indefinite period by a Committee of American Scholars, representing the American Historical Association, the Modern Language Association, the Political Science Association, the Mediaeval Academy of America, and the Committee on Slavic Studies of the American Council of Learned Societies.

The British founders of the *Slavonic and East European Review* exercised their right to resume its publication in 1945. At this time the American Editorial Committee carried out its original intention to continue the magazine in this country as an independent American publication to be known as the *American Slavic and East European Review*.

The *American Slavic and East European Review* appears quarterly in 128-page issues or semiannually in 250-page issues at a subscription price of \$5.00.
