
Drugs and Crime

Drugs and Crime illuminates the complex relations between drug use and crime and the formidable challenges they pose. Evaluating various public policies of prevention, treatment, and law enforcement, the contributors offer dynamic analyses of what are traditionally (and sometimes ambiguously) seen as supply-reducing and demand-reducing strategies. The authors of these ten commissioned essays show why some popular remedies (such as certain kinds of drug education and efforts to curtail international smuggling) may not be effective. Without proposing magical solutions, they describe the most promising approaches to one of America's worst social problems.

Because of the far-reaching impact of this difficult problem, *Drugs and Crime* will be a welcome review of current research for scholars of public policy, sociology, psychology, criminology, and legal studies.
