represented. Those who attended were enthusiastic and urged that future courses should be held in October or March, so it has been decided to have a second course THIS OCTOBER. The Sisters asked for lectures on Psychology and Philosophy.

It is hoped to establish a Marian Association of Prayer and Penance for Nurses and Patients and also to prepare for a National Association of Nursing Orders.

A COURSE FOR PARISH SISTERS


Proposed for February 6-11, 1956
