De-recognizing Taiwan: The Legal Problems

Victor H. Li

In the near future, the U.S. is likely to recognize the People's Republic of China as the government of China and withdraw recognition from the Republic of China. Yet, after withdrawal of recognition, the authorities and sixteen million inhabitants of Taiwan will not disappear, nor will countless American relationships with them cease.

What will be the status of this entity under international law?

How will pre-existing treaties or contractual obligations be affected by the switch in recognition?

How will withdrawing recognition alter American dealings with Taiwan in the areas of trade and investment, arms transfers, and immigration and travel?

Stanford Law Professor Victor H. Li examines international law and domestic U.S. legislation to see how the U.S. could terminate, if it wished to do so, its defense treaty commitments, while maintaining the present patterns of economic, cultural and other ties with Taiwan even after withdrawal of recognition.
