

DIAGNOSTIC PROTEIN EXTRACTS

A wide range of PROTEIN EXTRACTS in stable and convenient form for the diagnosis of sensitization to foreign proteins is now available. These extracts are in the form of paste with a glycerin-boric acid base, and are supplied in collapsible tubes with narrow outlets, so that minute quantities can be removed for tests. The technique is extremely simple; slightly scarify the site of the test and apply a small quantity of the paste, rubbing it in with any sterile appliance.

The series consists of 144 Protein Extracts from the following sources :--foods, 98; seasonings, 6; pollens, 9; bacteria, 14; hair, wool, or feathers, 10; besides horse serum, bovine serum, tobacco, and peptone.

A control paste is supplied consisting only of the glycerin-boric acid base. The Protein Extracts are also combined in groups, of which there are 27 in all, so that the patient's susceptibility toward five or six of the proteins may be tested with one scarification, thus materially economising time.

Each tube contains sufficient material for from 40 to 50 tests.
