gee's fear of persecution be well founded meant that a claimant had to show "a reasonable degree of likelihood" that he would be persecuted for a Convention reason if returned. The test was objective. Here, the Home Secretary had determined that the admitted threats to Tamils returned to Sri Lanka were the result of the troubled situation in that country and not as a result of persecution directed at the Tamils as a group.
