- seals is quick, painless, and efficient. Contracting Parties, as appropriate, shall adopt rules for their nationals and vessels under their respective flags engaged in the killing and capturing of seals, giving due consideration to the views of SCAR.
- (b) In the light of the available scientific and technical data, Contracting Parties agree to take appropriate steps to ensure that their nationals and vessels under their respective flags refrain from killing or capturing seals in the water, except in limited quantities to provide for scientific research in conformity with the objectives and principles of this Convention. Such research shall include studies as to the effectiveness of methods of sealing from the viewpoint of the management and humane and rational utilization of the Antarctic seal resources for conservation purposes. The undertaking and the results of any such scientific research programme shall be communicated to SCAR and the Depositary which shall transmit them to the Contracting Parties.

ANGLO-ARGENTINE AGREEMENT ABOUT COMMUNICATIONS WITH THE FALKLAND ISLANDS, 1971: A CORRECTION

In a letter to the Editor referring to a note on this subject published in *Polar Record*, Vol 16, No 100, 1972, p 100-04, the Argentine Ambassador in London has stated that the only document required for travel on the Argentine mainland is that referred to in paragraph 2 of the Joint Statement on Communications approved by the Argentine and British Governments. The paragraphs entitled "Travel Document" on p 104 of this note were not sent to the Secretary General of the United Nations.
