It organizes symposia at annual meetings which move around Europe and which have covered subjects like the Rights of Minority Groups, the Image of Science, the Study of the Human Genome, Population Migration, and the Search for Meaning in Contemporary Life. It has also established study groups, the first of which has published its findings in a book on 'Schooling in Contemporary European Society', other studies are in progress on Psychological Problems of Youth in a Changing Europe, Energy Forecasting, Higher Education, and Risk Assessment in Relation to Atmospheric Changes.

It can be seen that the Academia Europaea has a wide perspective and this is reflected in its new journal the European Review.
