



Chemotherapy in Acute Otitis Media

EVERY case of uncomplicated acute suppurative otitis media should be treated by sulphonamide therapy in accordance with the fundamental principles of high initial dosage and regular frequent administration. In this way the incidence of mastoiditis may be reduced to a low figure. When a bacteriological diagnosis has not been made DAGENAN—M & B 693 should be used as a proportion of cases are pneumococcal, but in known haemolytic streptococcal cases sulphanilamide (May &
