

ERRATA

The editors apologize to the authors and our readers for the two errors that appeared in recent issues of the journal, and which are corrected below.

Late in the printing process, a serious error occurred in David E. Doyel's article, "Charles Corradino Di Peso: Expanding the Frontiers of New World Prehistory," which was published in Vol. 59, No. 1, pp. 9–20. The second and third full paragraphs on p. 10 both begin with the same two printed lines: "Di Peso's first excavation for the Amerind was Babocomari Village, a late prehistoric site in the San Pedro River valley. The report (Di Peso 1951), which also served as his Master's thesis at the . . ." These are the correct two lines for the beginning of the second full paragraph. The third full paragraph should begin: "Di Peso and his family spent the summer of 1948 at the University of Arizona Archaeological Field School, where he had first-hand exposure to Haury's methods and ideas; this field school was . . ." Reprints of the article, available from the author, will contain the correct wording for both paragraphs.

Table 1 (p. 630) in the article "New Perspectives on the Clovis vs. Pre-Clovis Controversy," by David S. Whitley and Ronald I. Dorn, which appeared in Vol. 58, No. 4, pp. 626-647, should be corrected to read "Fell's Cave, Chile," in lieu of "Fell's Cave, Argentina."
