THE CONTRIBUTORS

RICHARD N. COOPER is Frank Altschul Professor of International Economics at Yale University. He is author of *The Economics of Interdependence* (1968) and co-author of the Brookings Institution's evaluation of the British economy, *Britain's Economic Prospects* (1968).

Chong-Do Hah is Professor of Government at Lawrence University. He is completing work on a book, *Theoretical Perspectives on Political Modernization: A Critical Study*, and is writing a short study on "Yoshida Shigeru's Political Leadership."

BENJAMIN S. LAMBETH, presently on leave from the Institute for Defense Analyses, is a Teaching Fellow in Government and a Graduate Research Associate of the Center for International Affairs at Harvard University. He is co-author of *The Soviet Union and Arms Control: A Superpower Dilemma* (1970), and is currently editing a symposium volume on *The Dynamics of Soviet Defense Policy*.

J. David Singer is Professor of Political Science at the University of Michigan, and Research Political Scientist at the Mental Health Research Institute there. Among his recent books is *Quantitative International Politics* (1968); in addition to the "Correlates of War" project, he is working on a study of the political development of the global system since the Congress of Vienna.

RAYMOND F. HOPKINS, Assistant Professor of Political Science at Swarthmore College, is the author of *Political Roles in a New State: Tanzania's First Decade* (1971), and a co-author of *Analysis of International Politics* (forthcoming). He is currently completing a study of Kenyan politics, and another on processes of political legitimation.

HAROLD and MARGARET SPROUT are Research Associates at the Center of International Studies, Princeton University, where Harold Sprout is also Professor of International Relations, Emeritus. Their latest book, Toward a Politics of the Planet Earth, was published in 1971; they are currently writing a book tentatively entitled Ecology and Politics: National and International.
