JOE GANI, 90 YEARS

December 15, 2014 marks Joe Gani's 90th birthday. In April this year the Applied Probability Trust, in conjunction with The University of Sheffield, hosted three lectures to mark fifty years of publication of the *Journal of Applied Probability* and, in December, a jubilee volume (JAP 51A) of papers will appear. These activities bear witness to the lasting impact of Joe Gani's initiatives in the early 1960s, when he played the major role in establishing the Applied Probability Trust as a means of facilitating publication of research papers in applied probability.

As Sir John Kingman noted in his jubilee lecture, few journals have been steered by the same individual for a period of fifty years. As Editor of the *Journal of Applied Probability* and *Advances in Applied Probability* for three decades, Joe initially took a hands on role in shaping and caring for these journals. Later, Chris Heyde took over, and then Søren Asmussen became Editor. However, Joe maintained a keen eye on the progress of both journals and of their sister Applied Probability Trust publications, *The Mathematical Scientist* and *Mathematical Spectrum*. We Trustees know how much this seemingly simple publication enterprise owes to its founder at all of the editorial, management, and strategic levels. Key to these endeavours is a determination to care for the people in his community, whether they be colleagues, writers, or employees.

Joe has been an academic leader, building departments, encouraging others, and showing the way forward, in the United Kingdom, USA, and Australia. From these bases, he has travelled much more of the world to encourage and cajole others in the world of international science.

Canberra has now been home for Joe since 1991. He also lived there for seven years from 1974 as head of CSIRO's Division of Mathematics and Statistics, and before that at the Australian National University in 1951 and 1961–64 as a research student, fellow, and senior fellow. It was appropriate, then, that a score of his some-time colleagues from the broader mathematical and statistical community marked this anticipated birthday at lunch in September at ANU's University House, his first Canberra 'home'.

Joe continues to edit *The Mathematical Scientist*, as he has since its inception in his days with CSIRO. His contribution to JAP 51A and continued collaboration with others on likeminded essays illustrating the power of applied mathematics testify to his belief in the role of mathematics in helping us to understand diverse aspects of the world around us.

As Trustees of the Applied Probability Trust, it is a pleasure and an honour to send Joe our warmest greetings for his birthday and to extend our heartfelt thanks for all that he has done for the Trust, the journals, and the applied probability community in general.
