

Weed Science accepts for review manuscripts describing original research on the biology, ecology, physiology, or management of weeds; and on herbicides, plant growth regulators, environmental issues, and other topics directly related to the science of weed management. Original research encompasses scholarship of discovery that brings forth new data, scholarship of integration that weaves knowledge into new patterns, and scholarship of application in which intellectual work applies existing knowledge.

Each published manuscript must be written as a logical unit that contributes to the advancement of scientific knowledge. Manuscripts should advance the conceptual framework of the science of weed management. Symposia papers and reviews are accepted.

Weed Science (ISSN 0043-1745) is an official publication of the Weed Science Society of America, 810 East 10th Street, Lawrence, KS 66044-8897 (785-843-1235). It contains referred papers describing the results of research that elucidates the nature of phenomena relating to all aspects of weeds and their control. It is published bimonthly, one volume per year, six issues per year beginning in January.

Membership is \$85 per year, student affiliate membership \$30, which includes receipt of *Weed Science, Weed Technology*, and *WSSA Newsletter*. Dues should be sent to WSSA, 810 East 10th Street, Lawrence, KS 66044-8897 not later than December 1 of each year. Membership in the society is on a calendar-year basis only.

Subscriptions (institutions, libraries, etc.) to *Weed Science* are \$95 per year, one volume per year of six issues beginning in January. Subscriptions to both *Weed Science* and *Weed Technology* (ISSN 0890-037X) (four issues per volume) are available for \$160 per year. New subscriptions and renewals begin with the first issue of the current volume and should be sent to WSSA, 810 East 10th Street, Lawrence, KS 66044-8897.

The Editor can make exceptions in advance when justified.

The Weed Science Society of America fully subscribes to the belief that progress in science depends upon the sharing of ideas, information, and materials among qualified investigators. Authors of papers published in *Weed Science* are therefore encouraged, whenever practicable and when state and federal laws permit, to share genotypically unique, propagative materials they might possess with other workers in the area who request such materials for the purpose of scientific research.
