The Cambridge History of The Bible

Cambridge University Press announce the publication of a new co-operative History of the use, the translations, the study, the influence, and the physical form of the Bible since the time of Jerome.

The first volume to appear (not the first in chronological order) is subtitled *The West from the Reformation to the Present Day* and is edited by Professor S. L. Greenslade with contributions from eighteen other scholars. The next volume to appear will be *The West from the Fathers to the Renaissance* and a volume on the English Bible is planned, covering the whole story from Roman times to the New English Bible.

The West from the Reformation to the Present Day is the history of the Bible's interpretation, of the linguistic work done on the biblical manuscripts, of the use of the Bible in preaching and missionary work and its place in the theology of the various denominations.
