Family and Population in East Asian History

Edited by Susan B. Hanley and Arthur P. Wolf. The 13 papers in this volume represent a concerted effort to place the historical demography of East Asia on a firm quantitative basis. They explore a wide range of Chinese and Japanese documentary sources and raise new and substantial questions about both family history and population change. The most important finding is that when viewed from a demographic perspective, China and Japan are seen to be fundamentally different societies, refuting Malthus's argument that "the state of Japan resembles in so many respects that of China, that a particular consideration of it would lead into many repititions." P'eng P'ai and the Hai-Lu-feng Soviet

Fernando Galbiati. The author emphasizes events in Hai-Lu-feng, but he also traces developments at higher levels of the CCP and the Kuomintang, events that would lead to P'eng P'ai's execution at the personal command of Chiang Kai-shek.






