Long neglected by the mainstream of international law and politics, Antarctica is today attracting serious attention for its geostrategic connotations and its potential economic wealth. Particularly during the past two decades, international interest in south polar exploration and exploitation has noticeably intensified as States have become increasingly aware of the finiteness of available natural resources. This volume seeks to examine major political, economic and legal issues affecting the Antarctic region within the framework of the legal regime which oversees activities there. Towards that end, respected authorities on polar affairs have contributed their thoughts on various issues which today impinge upon national interests, economic aspirations, political priorities, and legal considerations in and around Antarctica. Each contribution seeks to present new insights into important international legal and political activities affecting the Antarctic region.
