Manuscript format: Delete all identifying references from four of the five copies of your manuscript. Text, including footnotes and references, should be double spaced with 1-inch margins. Footnotes, references, tables, and figures should be placed at the end. An abridged style sheet is published from time to time in the *Review*; a full style sheet is available on request.
