Nasal Mast Cells: A Preliminary Report on their Ultrastructure

The ultrastructural morphology of mast cells in the nose and the adenoids are compared. Normal cells have a very varied morphology with electron dense granules which have scrolls occasionally. Cells from patients with perennial allergic rhinitis show variable degranulation in all areas examined. Few cells were seen in the surface epithelium. - 1. An Otological and Research Fellowship at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, Michigan, USA, for 6 months during 2000, to enable the holder to gain experience in advanced otology and skull base surgery under the supervision of Professor Steven Telian, the Head of the Division of Otolaryngology and Neurootology, and to undertake research at the Kresge Hearing and Research Institute under the direction of Professor Josef Miller.
- 2. An Otological Research Fellowship to work in the Coleman/Epstein Laboratory at the University of California, San Francisco, for 6 months during 2000. This Fellowship will offer the holder exposure to ear surgery including cochlear implantation, with the opportunity of attending grand rounds and meetings in the Department of Otolaryngology.
- 3. TWJ/Toronto Hospital Fellowship at the University of Toronto. A 6 month combined clinical/research Fellowship in neurotology, skull base and advance otological surgery is offered at the University of Toronto under the supervision of Drs Rutka and Hawke during 2000. Resources include the archival collection from the Ear Pathology Research

Laboratory of the University of Toronto, the temporal bone dissection laboratory, the multidisciplinary neurotology clinic of the Toronto Hospital and the Advanced Center for Hearing and Balance Testing. Exposure to functional endoscopic sinus surgery and aspects of sleep medicine is also available. Fellows will have the unique opportunity to travel to Thailand and participate in an outreach program with the Thai Rural Ear Nose and Throat Foundation. Attendance at all University and hospital based academic rounds and sponsored events will further enrich the Fellow's experience. Extension of this Fellowship with guaranteed match funding from the Toronto end is also possible for upwards of a further 6 months.

4. A clinical and research Otological Fellowship in the University of Cape Town, tenable at the Groote Schuur Hospital for 6 months during 2000. The Holder will be Assistant to Professor Sean Sellars and will carry out both clinical and research work under his direction. This Fellowship gives wide practical experience in all aspects of the specialty, in addition to otology. The appropriate salary will be paid by the Leon Goldman Charitable fund and the TWJ Foundation will make a grant to assist with travel expenses.






