#### SUBMISSION OF MANUSCRIPTS

All contributions must be submitted in three copies and doublespaced throughout. Footnotes should be placed at the end of the manuscript. The modified Library of Congress system of Cyrillic transliteration should be used.

In general, articles should not exceed 30 double-spaced pages, except where especially justified by extensive tables and charts. The University of Chicago Press *Manual of Style* should be consulted for purposes of style and footnoting. Authors should send a brief academic c.v. along with their articles. Manuscripts will not be returned unless specifically requested and postage provided. The editors reserve the right to edit all submissions.
