Franz Daschner, MD, Receives Award

One of SHEA's first foreign members, Franz Daschner, director of the Institute of Environmental Medicine and Hospital Epidemiology at the University Hospital in Freiburg, Germany, has won the highest award for environmental protection in Europe. The \$250,000 award from the

Federal German Environment Foundation was presented by the Federal President. Franz Daschner was honored for his efforts and achievements combining nosocomial infection control, cost-saving, and reduction of environmental pollution. He is the first doctor to be awarded the prize.
