#### Instructions for authors

Fetal and Maternal Medicine Review will accept reviews on all areas of maternal and fetal medicine. Although reviews are carefully solicited by the Editor-in-Chief, authors are also encouraged to submit reviews for publication.

To submit a manuscript, send three complete copies, including figures and illustrations to William Dunlop, Editor: Fetal and Maternal Medicine Review, Department of Obstetrics and Gynaecology, 4th Floor, Leazes Wing, Royal Victoria Infirmary, Newcastle upon Tyne, NE1 4LP, UK. Telephone: +44 191 232 5131 Ext 24132.

Manuscripts will be acknowledged only if the author encloses a stamped addressed postcard or international reply coupon.

There is no formal restriction on length. However, reviews should be of appoximately 8,000 words.

Type double-spaced throughout on one side only and number all pages consecutively. Following acceptance authors are encouraged to submit their final revised version of the paper on a personal computer disk, using WordPerfect, together with one hard copy version. Disks will not be returned. The publisher reserves the right to typeset any article by conventional means if the author's disk proves unusable.

Manuscripts should be prepared using SI units, with, if necessary, traditional units in parentheses. In tables and figures only SI units should be used, but blood pressure should be expressed in mmHg and haemoglobin as g/dl. Full stops should be used after contraction or abbreviations. Abbreviations should be spelled out when first used in the text unless it is a standard unit of measurement. Drugs should be given their approved, not proprietary, names and the source of any new or experimental preparation should be given.

Any statistical method should be detailed in the paper and new methods detailed in full or supported by references.

Figures should be numbered consecutively as they appear in the text. Mark each figure with the first author's name and figure number on the reverse, and indicate its orientation. Any indication of features of special interest should also be included. Authors should submit three copies of each illustration. Figures should be drawn or produced by computer to about twice the final size; wherever possible they will be reproduced with the authors original lettering. Photographs should be submitted with the proposed reduction or magnification indicated and referred to in the text as 'Fig. 1', etc.,

and noted in the margin of the typescript for insertion. Legends for all illustrations should be typed together, separately from the main text. A charge will be made for colour photograph reproduction.

Patients in photographs should not be identifiable and should have their eyes masked to conceal identity. Any identifiable photograph should be accompanied by written permission from the patient or the patient's parent or guardian where appropriate. If material has been published elsewhere, written consent for republication must be obtained from the copyright holder.

Tables with concise headings should be typed on separate sheets and numbered consecutively. Each table must have a text reference, in the form 'Table 1', etc. Indicate where tables are to be placed by means of a note in the margin.

References should follow the Vancouver style\* and be numbered in the order that appears in the text. The full list of references should give the names and initials of all authors (unless there are more than six, when only the first six should be given followed by et al.). The authors' names are followed by the title of the review, the journal or book name (the former being abbreviated in accordance with the style used in *Index Medicus*), volume number, first and last page reference. References to books and conference proceedings should also include place of publication and publisher (and editor(s) if appropriate). Authors must verify references against the original documents before submitting the review.

Proofs will be sent to the author for checking. Typographical or factual errors may be changed at proof stage. The publisher reserves the right to charge authors for correction of non-typographical errors.

25 offprints of each review will be supplied free to each first named author. Extra offprints may be purchased from the publisher if ordered at proof stage.

Submission of a paper will be taken to imply that it is unpublished and it is not being considered for publication elsewhere. Upon acceptance of a paper, the author will be asked to transfer copyright to the publisher.
