The Society serves as a meeting place and forum for scholars, teachers, officials, lawyers, and others, from some one hundred countries. In April, it holds a three-day Annual Meeting in Washington at which current problems of international law are discussed. The Society also sponsors regional meetings outside of Washington in co-operation with other institutions.
